**T**WO very fine Galleys are fitting out, which the Czarina designs to send as a Present to the King of Prussia. It is said they will cost upwards of 60,000 Crowns; but as the Season of the Year is so far advanced, it is believed it will not be possible to send them till next Spring. M. Spiegel, who has served in the Hessian Troops, is arrived here from Germany, and is to be a Major General in her Majesty's Service. Some very fine Horfes are daily expected here from Copenhagen, which the King of Denmark has sent as a Present to her Majesty, to the Great Chamberlain, Count Biron, and to General Soltikoff a Relation of her Majesty.

Seville, Oct. 31. The 25th Instant being the Birth-day of her Catholick Majesty, who entred into the Forty First Year of her Age, the Marquês de la Paz Councillour and Secretary of State, gave a magnificent Entertainment on that Occasion to all the Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction at this Court. On the 24th in the Evening a Fire broke out in some of the Offices adjoining to the Marquês de la Paz's House, which being near the Palace, occasioned great Alarm, but it was happily extinguished in about an Hour's Time without any considerable Damage. This Morning M. Patinho received an Express from Cadiz, with an Account of the Arrival of an Aviso from Porto Bello with Letters from Peru.

East-India House, Leadenhall-street, Nov. 8, 1732.

Whereas several of the Ballast-Men within the River of Thames have of late exacted Money from Masters of Ships, contrary to the Orders of the Corporation of Trinity House: The Master, Wardens, and Assistants of the said Corporation give Notice, that the ancient and accustomed Prices of Ballast within the said River are, 9 d. per Ton to Ships employed in the Coal Trade, 12 d. per Ton to all other British Ships, and 16 d. per Ton to foreign Ships; that they do not make or allow any farther Demand for the same, but have given strict Directions to the contrary; and that if any Person employed in carrying Ballast to Ships, shall presume to exact any farther Payment, he will be liable to be prosecuted for such Exaction.
