HE States of the Province of Zealand have passed a Resolution, in which they declare (without mentioning the Name of any Claimant) that the Marquifate of Flufhing and Ter Veer is independent and free from all Vaflalage, and that it is annexed henceforward to the Sovereignty of that Province. By the fame Refolution they direct the Receiver-General of the faid Province to pegociate the Sum of 250000 Florins, in order to fatisfy fuch Perfon as may make a Claim of Right to the faid Marquifate. The States of the Province of Holland are to affemble again to Morrow, and feveral of the Deputies are ar-rived. The Grand Penfionary is in a fuffi cient State of Health to affift in this Affembly, in which it is expected that the military Estimates and Establishments for the next Year will be finally fettled and agreed.
