**T**HE States of the Province of Zealand have passed a Resolution, in which they declare (without mentioning the Name of any Claimant) that the Marquisate of Flushing and Ter Veer is independent and free from all Vassalage, and that it is annexed henceforward to the Sovereignty of that Province. By the same Resolution they direct the Receiver-General of the said Province to negotiate the Sum of 250000 Florins, in order to satisfy such Person as may make a Claim of Right to the said Marquisate. The States of the Province of Holland are to assemble again to Morrow, and several of the Deputies are arrived. The Grand Pensionary is in a sufficient State of Health to assist in this Assembly, in which it is expected that the military Estimates and Establishments for the next Year will be finally settled and agreed.
