Vienna, November 15.

Yesterday the Emperour held a Cabinet Council; after which his Imperial Majesty and the Empress went to the Convent of Neubourg, to celebrate there the Festival of St. Leopold. It is assured at present, that the Count de Vehlen will be appointed Captain General of the Imperial Troops in the Austrian Netherlands. The Duke of Lorrain is expected here the 19th Instant from Presbourg, to compliment the Empress on Occasion of her Name-Day.

Berlin, Nov. 22, N. S. The King came hither last Tuesday from Potsdam. The next Day his Majesty, accompanied by all the General Officers, the Ministers of State, and Foreign Ministers, was present at the Nuptials of President Borck. M. Marchal de Biberstein, Minister of State, and his Majesty's Plenipotentiary at the Court of Poland, arrived here the same Day from Warsaw. He went immediately to give an Account to the King of the Success of his Negotiations, and was very graciously received by his Majesty. Count Jagozinsky, Minister Plenipotentiary from the Empress of Russia, gave this Day a most magnificent Entertainment to his Majesty. Count Levenwolde is preparing to return to Petersbourg; from whence we have received Advices, that several Persons have been seized there on Account of a Libel filled with Invectives against the Protestants, and addressed to the Clergy of Russia; and that Count Wratislaws, Ambassadour from the Emperour, was upon his Departure for Vienna.

Berlin, Nov. 25, N. S. His Prussian Majesty has kept his Chamber since Friday last, on Account of a Cold and great Oppression on his Breast, so that his Journey to Pomerania is put off, and perhaps entirely laid aside for this Season. M. Seckendorff is expected this Day, but his Stay here, it is thought, will not be long, he designing to spend most Part of this Winter at Hambourg, where it is now pretty confidently affirmed the King of Prussia will make him a Visit if his Health permits.

Hague, Nov. 28, N. S. The States have an Account from their Minister at Cologne, that on Monday last Count Polheim had administered an Oath, in the Name of the Bishop of Augsburg, to the Burghers and Mi-

litia of Duffeldorp, for the Eventual Succession of Bergues, &c. and that he was going to Juliers to do the like there. The States of Holland have been assembled since Wednesday, but have not yet come to a Conclusion upon any publick Affair.

Hague, Dec. 2, N. S. The States of Holland will continue their Assembly this Week, and very probably the next. There is a Project delivered to the Commissioners of the Admiralties, who have been here some Time upon Account of the new Tariff, to fit out for the Service of next Summer 12 Men of War or Frigates, to secure our Trade against the Saletines and Algerines, who threaten, according to some Advices, to break anew with the Hollanders.
