A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the Fifth Day of December next: We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Fifth Day of December, to Tuesday the Sixteenth Day of January next ensuing: And We have given Order to Our Chancery of Great Britain to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall on the said Sixteenth Day of January next be held, and sit for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgeses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Sixteenth Day of January next.

Given at Our Court at St. James's the Thirtieth Day of November, One thousand seven hundred thirty two, in the Sixth Year of Our Reign.

GOD Save the KING.

Vienna, Nov. 22, N. S. Wednesday last being the Festival of St. Elizabeth, the Empress's Name-Day, as well as the Archduchess's at Brussels, their Imperial Majesties received the Compliments on that Occasion of all the Ministers and Nobility, who made a numerous and splendid Appearance at Court, and after Church Service was over, their Imperial Majesties dined in publick, and had a great Consort of Musick: In the Evening there was a Serenade called Zenobia performed before their Imperial Majesties; after which they went to Supper in the Empress's Apartment. Thursday Morning the Emperour saw, in the Manege or Riding School of the Court, several young Horses exercised, and in the Evening assisted with all the Knights of the Golden Fleece at Chapel. Count Crafsau, the Swedish Envoy, is expected back from Sweden.

Hague, Dec. 5, N. S. On the 3d Instant the States of the Province of Holland passed a Resolution for reducing the number of Forces now in Pay, but that Reduction is not

to take Place till the 25th of March next. To Day those States separated. A Deputation is expected from the States of Zealand relating to the Affair of the Marquitate of Flushing and Terveer, in which the Prince of Nassau-Orange is concerned.
