A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the Fifth Day of December next : We, with the Advice of Our Privy do hereby publifh and declare, Council, That the faid Parliament shall be further prorogued on the laid Fifth Day of December, to Tuefday the Sixteenth Day of January next enfuing : And We have given Order to Our Chancellour of Great Britain to pre-pare a Commillion for proroguing the fame accordingly. And We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleafure, That the faid Parliament shall on the faid Sixteenth Day of January next be held, and fit for the Dilpatch of divers weighty and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgefles, and the Commillioners for Shires and Burghs of the Houle of Commons, are hereby required to give their Attendance ac-cordingly at Weftminster on the faid Sixteenth Day of January next.

Given at Our Court at St. James's the Thirtieth Day of November, One thoufand seven hundred thirty two, in the Sixth Year of Our Reign.

GOD Save the KING.

Vienna, Nov. 22, N. S. Wednefday laft being the Feftival of St. Elizabeth, the Emprefs's Name-Day, as well as the Archdutchels's at Bruffels, their Imperial Majefties received the Compliments on that Occasion of all the Ministers and Nobility, who made a numerous and fplendid Appearance at Court, and after Church Service was over, their Imperial Majefries dined in publick, and had a great Confort of Mulick : In the Evening there was a Serenade called Zenobia performed before their Imperial Majesties; after which they went to Supper in the Empress's Apart-ment. Thursday Morning the Emperour faw, in the Manege or Riding School of the Court, leveral young Horses exercised, and in the Evening affisted with all the Knights of the Golden Fleece at Chapel. Count Craffau, the Swedish Envoy, is expected back from Sweden.

Hague, Dec. 5, N. S. On the 3d Inftant the States of the Province of Holland paffed a Refolution for reducing the number of Forces now in Pay, but that Keduction is not

to take Place till the 25th of March next, To Day those States separated. A Deputation is expected from the States of Zealand relating to the Affair of the Marquilate of Flushing and Terveer, in which the Prince of Naflau-Orange is concerned.
