The British Merchants shewed all publick Demonstrations of Joy on that Occasion by Illuminations Bonfires, &c.

Copenhagen, Nov. 29, N. S. Last Night, upon Account of the Queen of Denmark's Birth-Day, there was a magnificent Entertainment at Friedericksberg, and all the Foreign Ministers had the Honour of supping at their Majesties Table.
