The next Day being the Anniversary of the King of Great Britain's Birth-Day, Claudius Rondeau, his Britannick Maſteſty's Reſident at this Court, gave a ſplendid Entertainment at Supper to a great many Perſons of Diſtinction, which was followed by a Ball. The Britiſh Merchants ſhewed all publick Demonſtrations of Joy on that Occaſion by Illuminations Bonfires, &c.
