For these 15 Days past a Sort of an Epidemical Distemper has raged here, which generally seizes People with a violent Cold, attended with the Head-Ach and Fever. Several Persons have died of it. The Empress was very much indisposed with it, but at present her Imperial Majesty is entirely recovered. The Duke of Lorrain set out from hence this Day on his Return to Presbourg.
