Frigate of Fifty Guns, called the Oldenbourg, was launched here a few Days ago. This is the Seventh hew Days ago. Hague, Dec. 12, N.S. The Deputation expected from Zealand upon the Account of Ter Veer and Vleifingue, has been retarded, and there is no Communication made yet to the States General of the Province of Zealand's Refolution. M. Masch, the Prushan Envoy, has prefented a Memorial to the States, as Executor of the late King William's Inheritance, to have the Papers delivered to him concerning the Seigneurie of Herftal, whofe fupreme Dominion is claimed by the Governels of the Auftrian Nether-lands, and by the Bifhop of Liege. The Ccancil of the Domaines is ordered to give him authentick Copies of them, but not the Originals. The State of War for the enfuing Year, which was prefented to the States General by the Council of State, has been fent to the respective Provinces; as likewife the Resolution of the States of Holland for the Reduction of the Troops.

Hague, Dec. 16, N. S. As the States of Guelderland had protested some Time ago against the Defign of making a Reduction of the Forces, when the States of Holland's Refolution was communicated to the Allem-

bly of the States General, their Deputies declared, that they infifted upon the Neceffity of keeping the Army upon the fame Foot it is at prefent. Overyssel declared the fame.
