M. le Fort, Envoy from the King of Poland, was taken very ill some Days ago, and continues very much indisposed.

Grand Pensionary, who it was thought was recovered of his late Fit of the Gout, is again confined to his Bed by a Relapse of it. Greffier Fagel is also indisposed with a violent Rheumatism, for which he has been twice let Blood. A great Number of People are seized here with the same Distemper, or a Cold attended with a Fever.
