THE Assembly of the States of the Province of Holland is to open the 7th Instant; and the Great Pensionary, as also the Grefrier M. Fagel, who have both been indisposed, are so well recovered, that it is believed they will give their Attendance in that Assembly. The Prince of Baden, Nephew of the Markgrave of that Name, who has been here some Time, sets out to Day on his Return to Germany, leaving here two young Princes his Brothers, who are solliciting to be employed in the Military Service of this State.
