HE King of Poland went to Leipzig Fair on Wednesday last, attended only by Count Frise, M. Bruhl, and his Master of the Horse; it is said his Majesty's chief Business is to buy, or make a Bargain with Horse-Dealers, to deliver him 600 Horses to remount entirely the Dragoons that were taken out of the Polish Regiments to be his Guard at Warsaw, and which are commanded by Colonel Rockau. His Majesty is expected back to Morrow, or next Day at farthest; he was a good deal out of Order with a Cold when he set out, and had been severish the Day before, which made People uneasy at his going. If he returns well, his Stay here will be very short, intending to begin his Journey to Poland about a Week hence.

Dresden, Jan. 7, N. S. The King of Poland returned from Leipzig the 4th Inftant, and is so well in Health, that the Night before last he was present at a Play acted at the Princess of Holstein's by People of Distinction; and last Night being the Beginning of the Carnaval, his Majesty was at the Masquerade: He is now preparing with all haste for his Journey to Warsaw, which remains fixed for the 10th. It is said that his Majesty made an Agreement with a Horse Dealer for the Delivery of 600 Horses at Warsaw in the Month of May next, for remounting the Troops commanded by Colonel Rockau. Here it is positively said, that a Marriage is agreed on between the second Son of the Duke of Bevern, and the Young Princess of Mecklenbourg.

Hague, Jan. 16, N. S. The States of Holland will separate To-morrow in order to reassemble next Tuesday. A Letter has been written by the Prince of Orange to the States General, and to the States of Holland: His Highness has also sent them a Copy of that he wrote to the States of Zealand, protesting against their Proceedings concerning the Marquisate of Ter Veer and Flushing; and has likewise sent Copies of it to all the Provinces.
