The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This Day the Right Honourable Sir Charles Wager, Kt. First Commissioner for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, &c. was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

Copenhagen, Jan. 24, N. S. Two other young Counts, Lynar and Roussen, are come hither also to offer their Services.

Berlin, Jan. 27, N. S. M. Johnn, the Danish Resident here, having received his Recredentials, and taken his Audiences of Leave of the King and Queen of Prussia, sets out from hence To-morrow for Hambourg, where he is to meet with his Orders and Instructions, and from thence will proceed with the same Character to the Court of Great Britain. On Saturday last Count Seckendorff and General Ginkel went to make a Visit to Duke Adolph of Weissenfels, with whom they intended to take the Diversion of Hunting for two or three Days, and to return hither this Evening or To-morrow.

Hague, Feb. 7, N. S. The Assembly of the States of Holland is to meet on Thursday next; but they will not dispose of the vacant Regiments that are on their Repartition till they meet again in March next. It was said the Prince of Orange would be going from hence this Week to Friesland, but he seems determined to continue here during the approaching Session of the States of Holland.
