Warsaw, January 31, N. S.

HIS Polish Majesty was last Night extremely ill, having for several Hours together had violent Pains in his Side, and an Imposthume is gathering in the Inside of his Thigh, which his Physicians and Surgeons are trying to bring to a Suppuration. He was so very bad that he was thought to be dying, and received the Extreme Unction.

Petersburg, Jan. 13, O. S. General Count Levenvolde arrived here the 9th Instant. The Prince of Bevern, it's thought, would have been here by this time if the Roads had not been so very bad, but he is soon expected, and is to be made a Colonel of one of the Regiments of Cuirassiers at his Arrival; as yet it is not known when he is to marry Princess Anne, who has been very ill for some Days of the Meazels; but it is said she is out of Danger. It is reported that the Dukes of Mecklenbourg and Holstein have made very pressing Instances to her Majesty, to permit them to come to this Place, but it is thought the Czarina will not grant their Request.

Berlin, Feb. 7, N. S. Yesterday Morning the King of Prussia set out for Brunswick. The principal Persons of his Retinue are, the Prince Royal, the Duke of Holstein, Count Seckendorff, General Groinkow, General Bodenbroke, and Colonel Dershaw. His Prussian Majesty is expected back about the 21st Instant; during his Absence the Queen is come to reside here. The Duke of Bevern left Potsdam in order to go home on Monday last. This Court has had Advice by three different Couriers of the Death of the King of Poland, which happened at Warsaw on the 1st Instant in the Morning.

Hague, Feb. 13. We have an Account from Wesel, that Colonel Leithen, who has a Regiment of Foot in the Service of the States, and has some Lands in the Country of Cleves, being gone to visit them, has been seized there and conducted to Wesel, where he is kept Prisoner, with 16 other Officers or Soldiers, besides many others arrested in other Places of the Country of Cleves who are in the Service of the States or their Subjects. On Occasion of the Differences with the King of Prussia it was proposed the 11th Instant in the Assembly of Holland, to put off the Reduction of the Troops for two Months longer from the appointed Time; all the Deputies consented to it excepting those of Amsterdam. The Government of Heusden, vacant by the Promotion of General Frieheim, was this Day given to Colonel Palm.
