Petersbourg, January 20, O. S.

Yesterday being the Anniverary of her Czarish Majesty's Accession to the Throne, all the Foreign Ministers and Persons of Distinction were invited to dine at Court; in the Evening there was a Ball and a fine Illumination. Though it is assured that Princess Anne is entirely recovered of the Measles, she did not appear at Court. Her Majesty has made Count Wratislaw a Present of her Picture set with Diamonds, valued at about 10000 Crowns. His Excellency designs to set out from hence for Vienna next Week, so that he will not wait for the Arrival of the Prince of Bevern, who is daily expected. M. Simon Andreish de Soltikoff, who is related to her Majesty, and is great Governour of Moscow, arrived here from that Place some Days ago, and the Czarina honoured him the 19th Instant with the Title of Count.

Warsaw, Feb. 3, N. S. The King of Poland died on Sunday the 1st Instant, about Five in the Morning. The Corpse was carried the same Evening from the Palace in the Suburbs to the Castle in Town, where it was delivered to the Grand Marshal to be exposed to View under a Canopy of State, according to the Custom of the Country; and Yesterday in the Evening it was embalmed. The Primate and Grand Marshal have given strict Orders for preserving Peace and Quietness in the Town, and hitherto there have been no Disturbances, except at the Primate's own House, where was a Quarrel on Sunday between the Prince Wiefnovieski, Regimentary of Lithuania, and the Palatine of Lublin, inasmuch that they began to draw their Sabres, and gave Orders to their Followers on each Side to do the same; but M. Poniatowski, and Numbers of the Nobility with their Attendance being present, prevented any Mischief being done. To Day there is to be a Meeting of the Senators at the Primate's for publishing the Inter-Regnum, and assembling a Diet of Convocation, as they call it, which lasts six Weeks, and at which the Diet of Election will be appointed, which last cannot be sooner than the latter End of August.

Hague, Feb. 20, N. S. The States and Council of State will have a Conference in a few Days upon the Affairs of the Prince of Nassau Orange, and very probably the Deputation expected from Zealand will be here against that Time, the States of that Province being to meet next Tuesday, when it is thought they will name the Deputies.
