Hague, March 6, N. S. The French Am-baffadour, and the Envoys of the Emperour and King of Great Britain, have this Morning feparately had Conferences with the Deputies of the States, on Account of the Answer given to a Memorial of M. Ginkel from the King of Prufia, which was brought hither by Express the 4th Instant in the Evening, and has been communicated to those three Minifters. The Allembly of the States of Holland The continues fixed for the 12th Instant. Commissioners ordered to examine the Additions and Corrections defired by the Frince of Orange to be inferted in the Refolution of the States concerning the Delivery of his Part of the Effects of the late King William, made their Report Yesterday, and were of Opinion they may be accepted, and it is thought the Province of Holland, and the other three which have taken the Matter *ad referendum*, will not be against it. Count Chiusano, Minister from the King of Sardinia, having obtained Leave to return home, on Account of his ill State of Health, is to take his Leave To-morrow of the States by a Memorial.
