Hague, March 13, N. S. HE States of Holland have this Day disposed of the Military Employments vacant in their Department. The Regiment of the Life-Guards is bestowed upon M. van Duyn, one of the Nobles of Holland, and a Captain in the faid Regiment, upon Condition that he leave the Pay of Colonel during Life to Major General Sayer, Lieutenant Colonel of the fame Regiment. The Scotch Regiment of Cunningham is given to M. Lamy, Lieute-nant Colonel of the fame Regiment, and M. Winfheim is made Colonel of the Regiment Several vacant Companies are of Huffel. likewife difposed of, and the Deputies of the States will, as usual, dispose in a little Time of Grune of Jending the faid anonymous threatning Let, the vacant Subaltern Committions.

Hague, March 17, N. S. On the 15th Inftant Count Sinzen lorff received an Express from Vienna: And he is ordered to employ his best Offices here to compose the Differences between the King of Pruffia and the States. He has delivered to their High Mightinefles a Letter from the Emperour, ex-horting them to Peace and Tranquility, and offering his Mediation on this Occasion. The States of Holland have orefumed their Allembly to Day, and it is expected that before they part they will declare, their Senti-ments upon the Delivery of the late King William's Effects demanded by the Prince of The States of Utrecht have at laft Orange, authorized their Deputies here to confent to it, with the Additions and Corrections inade by the faid Prince. The Deputation from Zealand concerning his Affairs, is to fet out, it is faid, To-morrow, for this Place. All the Military Officers are ordered to their refpective Regiments, not upon any Apprehension of War, but on Account of the Exercises which are to begin next Month in the feveral Garrifons, Count Chiusano, Minister of Sardinia, has left this Place to proceed on his Journey to Turin by the Way of Paris, where he is to meet the Count de Canalle, who is coming hither in his Room.

## Dublin-Cafile, March 2.

Yesterday being Her Majesty's Birth-Day, the great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out upon Oxmantown Green. At Noon there was a numerous Appearance of the Nability and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle, 'to compliment their Excellencies the Lords Juftices upon this Occafion ; before whom a Song was performed. After which their Excellencies, attended with the Guard of Battle-Axes, and a Squadron of Dragoons, made a Tour round St. Stephen's Green. In the Evening there was a Play given by their Excellencies for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other usual Demonstrations of Joy.

Whitehall, Feb. 27, 1732-3. Whereas Rogers Holland, of Chippenham, in the County of Wilts, Efg., having in the Month of Septem-ber last, with the Affiftance of his Neighbours and Servants, feized and committed to Salisbury Goal, Three-Perfons, who with feveral others supposed to belong to the Coal-Works in the Forest of Kingswood in the County of Gloucester, were in a riotous Manner pulling down and destroying the Turnpikes cretted by Att of Parliament on the Road near Ghippenham aforefaid; an Anonymous Letter was on the 7th Day of February Instant, sent to Mr. John Stock his Tenant, to be commu-nicated to him the faid Mr. Holland, threatning the firing by Night, or pulling down of his Houfe, and Mifchief to bis Perfon, in Cafe he do profecute the Perfons imprisoned as abovementioned for the said Offence: His Majefy, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in the beinous ter, is pleafed to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so as he or they may be apprehended and convicted shereof.

And as a further Encouragement, His Majefly is alfa pleased to promise a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds to any one of them, or to any other Person or Per-fons who shall make such Discovery as aforefaid, to be paid on the Conviction of the Offender or Offenders. HOLLES NEWCASTLE.
