*Hague, March 13, N. S.*

**T**HE States of Holland have this Day disposed of the Military Employments vacant in their Department. The Regiment of the Lifeguards is bestowed upon M. van Duyn, one of the Nobles of Holland, and a Captain in the said Regiment, upon Condition that he leave the Pay of Colonel during Life to Major General Sayer, Lieutenant Colonel of the same Regiment. The Scotch Regiment of Cunningham is given to M. Lamy, Lieutenant Colonel of the same Regiment, and M. Winheim is made Colonel of the Regiment of Huffel. Several vacant Companies are likewise disposed of, and the Deputies of the States will, as usual, dispose in a little Time of the vacant Subaltern Commissions.

*Hague, March 17, N. S.* On the 15th Instant Count Sinzenlorff received an Express from Vienna: And he is ordered to employ his best Offices here to compose the Differences between the King of Prussia and the States. He has delivered to their High Mightinesses a Letter from the Emperour, exhorting them to Peace and Tranquility, and offering his Mediation on this Occasion. The States of Holland have resumed their Assembly to Day, and it is expected that before they part they will declare their Sentiments upon the Delivery of the late King William's Effects demanded by the Prince of Orange. The States of Utrecht have at last authorized their Deputies here to consent to it, with the Additions and Corrections made by the said Prince. The Deputation from Zealand concerning his Affairs, is to set out, it is said, To-morrow, for this Place. All the Military Officers are ordered to their respective Regiments, not upon any Apprehension of War, but on Account of the Exercises which are to begin next Month in the several Garrisons. Count Chiufano, Minister of Sardinia, has left this Place to proceed on his Journey to Turin by the Way of Paris, where he is to meet the Count de Canalle, who is coming hither in his Room.

*Dublin-Castle, March 2.*

Yesterday being Her Majesty's Birth-Day, the great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Yollies from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out upon Oxmantown Green. At Noon there was a numerous Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle, to compliment their Excellencies the Lords Justices upon this Occasion; before whom a Song was performed. After which their Excellencies, attended with the Guard of Battle-Axes, and a Squadron of Dragoons, made a Tour round St. Stephen's Green. In the Evening there was a Play given by their Excellencies for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other usual Demonstrations of Joy.

Whitehall, Feb. 27, 1732-3.

Whereas Rogers Holland, of Chippenham, in the County of Wilt, Esq; having in the Month of September last, with the Assistance of his Neighbours and Servants, seized and committed to Salisbury Goal, Three Persons, who with several others supposed to belong to the Coal-Works in the Forest of Kingswood in the County of Gloucester, were in a riotous Manner pulling down and destroying the Turnpikes erected by Act of Parliament on the Road near Chippenham aforesaid; an Anonymous Letter was on the 7th Day of February Instant, sent to Mr. John Stock his Tenant, to be communicated to him the said Mr. Holland, threatening the firing by Night, or pulling down of his House, and Mischief to his Person, in Case he do prosecute the Persons imprisoned as abovementioned for the said Offence: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in the heinous Crime of sending the said anonymous threatening Letter, is pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so as he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And as a further Encouragement, His Majesty is also pleased to promise a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds to any one of them, or to any other Person or Persons who shall make such Discovery as aforesaid, to be paid on the Conviction of the Offender or Offenders.
