THE Case of the Dutch Merchants at Coningsberg, of whom the King of Prussia has demanded 250000 Crowns, by way of Contribution towards maintaining and settling the Saltzburghers who have taken Refuge in his Territories, was Yesterday laid before the Assembly of the States of the Province of Holland; the Members of which Assembly have resolved to transmit it to their respective Towns for their Consideration and Advice. The late Will of General Hompefch was opened a few Days ago, and it appears that he has left the Bulk of his Estate to a Child of two Years old, who is the Son of a Niece of his married to Baron de Heide. The Death of the King of Poland was some Days ago notified to the States General by a Letter from the Imperial Kingdome; and Yesterday the Imperial Location was made on the 20th of March at Saxony, by the Saxons residing here, who at the same Time presented to their High Mightinesses several Confidential Letters from that Prince. The Deputation expected from Zealand upon the Affair of Ter Veer and Flushing, consisting of ten Persons, is expected here daily, Lodgings being already taken for them. Count Sinzendoff, the Emperour's Minister, had a Conference to Day with the Deputies of the States, upon the Differences between them and the King of Prussia. The States of Holland continue their Assembly, and it is thought will not separate till after they have seen the Deputies expected from Zealand.
