Hague, March 24, N. S.

THE Ten Deputies from Zealand came higher on Saturday last, and have been complimented upon their Arrival on the Part of the States of Holland by the President and three Deputies of their Assembly. General Frisheim who had lately the Government of Boisleduc conferred upon him, but had not taken Possession of it, died here last Night after two Days Illness of a great Cold with a Fever. This Morning the States disposed of that Government to the Prince of Holstein-Beck Governour of Ypres. M. du Portail is made Governour of Ypres, in whose Room M. de Verschuur is made Commandant of Namur, and in his Room M. de Swartsenbourg is made Commandant of the Citadel of Namur. Baron Bunau, who is sent from the Elector of Saxony to notify to his Britannick Majesty the Death of the late King of Poland, arriv'd here Yesterday, and will forthwith proceed for London.

St. James's, March 16. This Day M. John, Resident from the King of Denmark, had a private Audience of her Royal Highness the Princess Royal, and their Royal Highnesses the Princesses Amelia and Caroline; to which he was introduced by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Master of the Ceremonies.

He had afterwards a private Audience of their Royal Highnesses the Princesses Mary and Louisa, being introduced by the Master of the Ceremonies.
