**O**N Thursday last the Marquess de la Chetardie, who is charged with the Affairs of France at this Court, presented to the Ministers the Copy of new Credentials which he has received from his Court as Minister; and he is to go to Morrow to Potzdam to take an Audience of his Prussian Majesty in that Quality, and deliver his original Credentials,

Hague, March 27, N. S. M. de Sinsendorff, the Emperour's Minister here, has informed the Ministry, that the King of Prussia has referred the whole Dispute between him and this Republick to the Emperour; and that he would forthwith send the Dutch Soldiers to Ruremond, to be disposed of as his Imperial Majesty should think fit. The said Minister has put into the Pensionary's Hands a Copy of the King of Prussia's Letter to the Emperour, accepting of his Imperial Majesty's Mediation, in order to be communicated to the States; and in all Probability the States will very soon come to the like Resolution. The Deputies of Zealand have prevailed with the States of Holland to joyn with them in endeavouring to perswade the Prince of Orange to accept of an Equivalent for the Marquisate of Ter Veer and Flushing. Baron Bunau, who is going for England, as Minister from the Elector of Saxony, sets out from hence To-morrow to embark at Rotterdam.

The Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury having appointed Money for paying of Half Pay to Sea Officers, from the 30th of June 1732, to the 31st of December last, according to his late Majesty's Establishment on that Behalf; These are to give Notice, that the said Payment will begin to be made at the Treasurer of the Navy's Office in Broad-street, at Nine of the Clock in the Morning, the following Days, viz. on Thursday the 29th of this Month for the Captains, Friday the 30th for the Lieutenants, and Saturday the 31st for the Masters and Surgeons; that all Persons concerned may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and not only bring with them the Affidavit required touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any publick Employment, either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to be paid the said Half Pay, but also produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Tests and taken the Oaths required by Act of Parliament to his present Majesty. And in Case any of the said Officers shall not be able to attend themselves to receive their Money, but employ Attornies for that Purpose, that the said Attornies may produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.
