HIS Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Charles Dalton, Gentleman-Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from his Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, his Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to,

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Desertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

An Act to indemnify Persons, who have omitted to qualify themselves for Employments or Offices, by taking the Oaths and making and subscribing the Declaration against Transubstantiation, and receiving the Sacrament; and allowing them further Time for that Purpose.

An Act for allowing further Time for the Inrollment of Decds and Wills made by Papists, and for Relief of Protestant Purchasers and Lessees.

An Act for obviating a Doubt which may arise upon an Act made in the fourth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, Intituled, An Act that all Proceedings in the Courts of Justice, within that Part of Great Britain called England, and in the Court of Exchequer in Scotland, shall be in the English Language; so far as the same doth or may relate to the Court of the Receipt of his Majesty's Exchequer, or to any Members or Branches thereof.

An Act for the free Importation and Exportation of Diamonds, Pearls, Rubies, Emeralds, and all other Jewels and precious Stones.

An Act to explain and amend two Acts of Parliament, one made in the Twelfth, and the other in the thirteenth Year of his late Majesty's Reign, for making navigable the River Dun, in the County of York; and for the better perfecting and maintaining the said Navigation, and for uniting the several Proprietors thereof into one Company.

An Act for rebuilding the Parish Church of St. George the Martyr, in the Borough of Southwark, in the County of Surry, as one of the Fifty new Churches, directed to be built by two Acts of Parliament, one made in the Ninth, the other in the Tenth Year of the Reign of her late Majesty Queen Anne.

And to four private Bills.

GOD Save the King.

Hague, March 31, N. S. The King of Prussia having accepted the Emperor's Mediation for composing the Differences between his Prussian Majesty and the States, it was notified to them Yesterday by the Prussian Minister, and by Count Sinzendorff, who had at the same Time a long Conference with the States Deputies on that Subject. To-morrow the States are to meet early, to consider upon what Conditions they shall consent to their Mediation. The States of Overysel, who met lately, have sent their Resolution to the States General, consenting to the Delivery of the Effects demanded by the Prince of Orange. The Deputies of Zealand have had already two or three Conferences with the States of Holland upon the Affair of Ter Veer and Flushing.
