**P** Reparations are already making for the King of Denmark's Journey to Norway, though his Majesty has not positively declared his Resolution to that Purpose.

*Hague, April 3, N. S.* The States of Holland resolved Yesterday to defer the Reduction of the Troops for Six Weeks longer, viz. from the 6th of May to the 17th of June, and their Resolution in Form on that subject was accordingly delivered to Day by their Deputies to the States General. The Deputies of Zealand having had several Conferences with those of the States of Holland, set out Yesterday to return to their Province; and the others communicated to the States General a Resolution, whereby they declare the States of Holland approve and join with Zealand to maintain the Devassalage of the Marquisate of Ter Veer and Flushing, on paying to the Prince of Orange, whom they look upon now to be the Owner, an equitable Equivalent; and as to the Delivery of the rest of the Effects left by the late King William, they declared they were not ready to give their final Opinion. When the Pensionary delivered his Advice to the Assembly upon the Draught of a Resolution or Report relating to the Delivery of those Effects, the Deputies of several Towns demanded that the Matter should be taken ad referendum, pretending heir said Towns had some Objections to make before the Delivery should be consented to. The Prince of Nassau Siegen, of the Protestant Line; who has a Regiment in the Service of the States, being authorized by full Powers which he has received from Prince Hiacinthe of Nassau Siegen, who is in Spain, has presented a Petition to the Court of Brabant, where is depending a Suit in Law concerning his Pretensions to Part of the forefaid Effects, to obtain an Order for stopping the said Delivery till the Cause be decided; which Petition was referred by the Court of Brabant to the States General, when another Petition was presented to them by the said Prince of Nassau Siegen demanding the same thing. That Tribunal of the Court of Brabant is composed of Members

subject to the Province of Holland. The Prince of Orange designs to set out for Friesland on Tuesday next, and to return hither in eight or ten Days. The States of Holland separated this Day. M. Malch, the Prussian Minister, has this Day informed the States, that the King his Master has ordered the Dutch Soldiers to be set at Liberty. The States are come to a Resolution to accept of the Emperour's Mediation for terminating the Differences between them and his Prussian Majesty.
