Petersbourg March 6, O. S.

THE Prince of Bevern, who lately arrived here, has been very kindly received by her Czarish Majesty, who has given him a handsome House near the Palace, and has ordered one of the Gentlemen of her Bedchamber to attend him. As yet the Prince's Table is served by her Majesty's Cooks, and her Coaches attend him whenever he goes out; but it is thought he will soon have an Equipage and Servants of his own, this Court designing to settle a yearly Pension on his Highness, and to give him a Regiment of Cuirassiers.

Hague, April 7, N. S. It is confirmed that the King of Prussia has ordered the Dutch Soldiers to be set at Liberty, and it is thought the Emperour will have no great Difficulty to reconcile his Prussian Majesty with this Republick. The Prince of Orange set out this Morning for Friesland, and is to return in Ten Days Time, in order to wait the Determination of his Affairs.

St. James's, March 26.
