Eneral Count Levenvolde is to fet out this Evening or to Morrow Morning to go to Warsaw as her Czarish Majesty's Ambassadur Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary. His Excellency's Retinue will be so numerous, that it is believed his Embassy will be one of the most magnificent that has been seen in Europe for a long while. He will have above 20 Officers and Gentlemen, sive of the Czarina's Coaches and sive Setts of very sine Horses, 12 of her Majesty's Footmen, and six Pages with her Majesty's Liveries, besides a vast Number of his own Servants. He is to be guarded by 50 of her Majesty's Horse-Guards, and 18 Grenadiers of his own Regiment of Foot Guards. M. Lipsky is expected here from Poland, to notify the Death of the late King to this Court; as is also Count Lynard from the Elector of Saxony.
