*Hague, May 15, N. S.* The States of Holland assembled on Wednesday last. They have two Affairs under Consideration, viz. The Continuation of their State of War upon the Foot as it is during this whole Year; and the Prince of Orange's Demands of the Estate and Effects left him by the late King William; but whether they will come to any Resolution upon these two Heads, it is not yet known.
