N the 3d Instant the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland met at Edinburgh, and chose for their Moderator Mr. John Gowdie, one of the Ministers of that City, His Majesty's Commission constituting the Right Honourable the Marquess of Lothian His Majesty's High Commissioner, was read, as was also His Majesty's most gracious Letter to the General Allembly. His Majesty's High Commissioner made a Speech to the Assembly, to which the Moderator in their Name returned a very re-fpectful Answer. Then a Committee being appointed, drew up a most loyal and dutiful Answer to His Majesty's most gracious Letter; which Answer was unanimously agreed to; and having been transmitted to his Grace the Duke of Newcastle, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has by him been laid before His Majesty, who was pleased to receive it very graciously, and is as follows.

May is please your Majesty,

I'T is with the greatest Joy, we understand
by your Majesty's most gracious Letter,
that the Proceedings of our former Allemblies
have given so much Satisfaction to your Majesty, that you are now graciously pleased to countenance our present Meeting with your Royal Approbation and Authority, and to renew the Assurances formerly given us of your fixed and unalterable Resolution, to maintain this National Church in all its Rights and Priviledges.

As it is our unquestionable Duty, so it shall be our Study and Care, to express the most sincere Loyalty, Zeal, and Affection for your Majesty's Person and Government, and

for your Royal Family,

As we are now met together by the good Providence of God, and under the Protection of your Majesty's Authority, so we shall sincerely and heartily, through Divine Grace, endeavour to promote, as far as in us lies, the Honour and Glory of God, the Peace and Prosperity of the Church of which we are Members, the Advancement of true Religion and Virtue, and the Good of our Country; and in order thereunto, we shall, according to your Majesty's gracious Recommendation, confult upon the proper Means of preventing the Growth of Popery, and suppressing all Prophaneness and Immorality.

We shall be much encouraged, in pursuing these great and good Ends, by the Assurance your Majesty is pleased to give us, that while we do so, we may always depend upon your Royal Protection and Favour, and your ready Concurrence in such prudent Measures as may most effectually answer such pious Pur-

poles.

We hope that all our Confultations shall be conducted with that Prudence and Moderation, that Charity and Brotherly Love, that becomes such a Body; which, under God, and the gracious Influence of your Majesty's Countenance, will give Weight to our Determinations, and Success to our Endea-

The Loyalty and Zeal of the most Honourable the Marquess of Lothian for your Ma-jesty's Service, his affectionate Concern for the Church of Scotland, his Abilities for the Discharge of so great a Trust, of which we have had former Experience, make your Ma-jesty's Choice of him to represent your Royal Person in this Assembly most acceptable to us; and we beg Leave to affure your Majesty, that nothing shall be wanting on our Part, to make the Discharge of his high

Trust easy and agreeable to him, We offer up our most unseigned Thanks to our gracious God, that he has been please ed, in his great Goodness, to place your Ma-jesty upon the Throne of your Ancestors, which is so great a Bleffing, not only to your Majesty's own Dominions, but to all the Protestant Churches: And we servently pray, That God may bless and long preserve pray, That God may bleis and long prejeryo your Majesty; That you may be ever under the gracious Protection of his Providence, and Conduct of his good Spirit; That he may bless and long preserve your Royal Consort the Queen, his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, and all the rest of the Royal Family; and that there may never be wanting one of your Royal House to sway the Scepter over us; these are, and shall be, the Prayers of,
