Hague, May 26, N. S.

THE States of Holland adjourned last Saturday for a Week, after having passed a Resolution to put off the Reform of the Troops to the 29th of July next. Count Sinzendorff received to Day an Answer to the Memorial he presented, touching the Protestant Counsellor nominated by the States to be one of the Court of Justice at Venlo; Their High Mightinesses insist on their Right to that Nomination. On Saturday last their High Mightinesses sent a Deputation to the Marquis de Fenelon, the French Ambassadour, to compliment him on the Birth of a Princess of France; on which Occasion it is said he will make a great Entertainment some Day this Week. The Count de Canales is arrived, being to reside here as Minister of the King of Sardinia, in the Room of Count Chiufan, who went away some time ago. Mr. Finch, Minister from the King of Great Britain, has been in Conference with some of the Lords of the Regency.
