Seville, May 19, N. S.

**O**N the 16th Instant, between One and Two in the Afternoon, their Catholick Majesties set out from hence for Aranjuez, accompanied by the Prince and Princess of Asturias, and the Infante Don Philip. The rest of the Royal Family is to stay here till their Carriages arrive from Madrid, from whence they are expected about the latter End of the Week. The same Day his Excellency Don Joseph del Giudice, Duke of Giovenazzo, and Prince of Cellamare, Master of the Horse to her Catholick Majesty, a Grandee of Spain, and Knight of St. Jago, and of the Order of the Holy Ghost, died suddenly of an Apoplectick Fit, aged 78, as he was dressing in order to wait upon their Catholick Majesties on this Journey. He was a Person of great Wealth, Learning, and Abilities, and had formerly resided at Paris as Ambassadour from this Court during the late Duke of Orleans's Regency. The Bishop of Barcelona received an Expres the Night before last, with the News of his having been named Commissary of the Crusada by his Catholick Majesty, in the Room of the Inquisitor General, whose Life is dispaired of.

*Hague, June 19, N. S.* The States of Holland assembled this Morning. Count Sinzendorff had this Morning a Conference with the Deputies of the States upon the Affairs that relate to the Regency of the County of Bentheim. General Keppel continues still very ill, and it is believed that he will not recover. The Marchioness de Fernelon was brought to Bed some Days ago of a Daughter. The Prince of Orange talks of making a Tour into Friesland in a few Days.

*Whitehall, June 12.*

Yesterday being the Anniversary of His Majesty's Succession to the Crown, there was a numerous and splendid Appearance at Court of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment

their Majesties on that happy Occasion. The Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired, and all publick Demonstrations of Joy were shewn throughout the Cities of London and Westminster.

*At a Meeting of the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners appointed by His Majesty's Letter Patent to take a Survey of the Officers of the Courts of Justice in England and Wales, and to enquire into their Fees.*

Ordered, That all Persons claiming to be Officers, Clerks or Ministers of or within the Ecclesiastical Courts of the Diocesses of Bath and Wells and Carlisle, and of the Archdeaconries of Lincoln and Northampton, and all other Courts Ecclesiastical and Civil in England and Wales and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, who have not yet given in their Lists of Fees, pursuant to their Lordships former Orders, do forthwith lay before their Lordships (by leaving the same in Writing, signed by the several and respective Officers, with Mr. Joshua Sharpe, the Secretary to this Commission, at his Chambers, No. 6, in Pump Court in the Temple) an Account of the Nature of their respective Offices, and what Service, Charge and Attendance doth belong unto each of them by Virtue of their respective Offices, and what Fees, Rewards and Wages every of the said Officers, Clerks and Ministers, and their Substitutes or Under-Clerks, have and take for and in Respect of their several Offices and Places.

*Whitehall, May 29, 1733.*

*Whereas the Commissioners of Excise have represented, that Samuel Alexander, a Watchman, in the Parish of St. Giles's Cripplegate, in the Lordship's Liberty, and County of Middlesex, having the Seventeenth Instant, about Three a Clock in the Morning, with the Assistance of the Headborough of the Night, and other Watchmen, stopped a Man and a Woman loaded with Ran Tea, and having the said Woman in Custody, as soon as the Headborough and other Watchmen were gone to the Watch-House with the said Tea, the said Woman crying out for Assistance, two Men on Horseback unknown, one on a Chestnut Horse, the other on a Grey Horse, came and not only rescued her, but beat the said Samuel Alexander in so cruel and barbarous a Manner, that his Skull was fractured, and he died the same Evening: His Majesty, for the better Discovery and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Murder, is pleased to promise His most Gracious*
