TH E States General have appointed M. Ginkel, now residing as their Minister at Berlin, to succeed the late Baron Keppel as Governour of Bergen-op-zoom; and M. Ginkel's Government of Venlo is given to Brigadier van der Duyn. The Office of Grand Bailiff of Boisleduc is not yet disposed of; as it is a very considerable Employment, there are several Competitors for it. The Corpse of Baron Keppel was Yesterday removed from hence, to be carried to Guelderland. The States of Holland separated to Day, and will meet again the Middle of next Month. The Prince of Orange proposes to make a Tour to Friesland next Week, and to return hither in a few Days.

same, upon his or their producing a proper Certificate of such Person or Persons being so convicted as aforesaid.
