Petersbourg, June 2, O. S.

NINE or Ten Men of War and Four Frigates are fitting out at Crownstadt. The Men of War are to be commanded by Admiral Gordon, who is to sail about the Gulf of Finland, to exercise the Seamen; two of the Frigates are to go to Archangel for the same Intent, and the two others, it is said, are to be sent to the Island of May or to Lisbon to fetch Salt, and to exercise the Seamen. The 28th of last Month the Czarina came to the Admiralty to see two Frigates launch'd, one of 32 Guns, call'd Mittau, and one of 36 Guns, built after the French Manner, and call'd the Princess Ann.

Warsaw, June 20, N. S. A Minister from the Kan of Tartary is lately arrived here, and has delivered a Letter to the Primate, and another to the Palatin of Kiovia, full of Assurances of Friendship for the Republick. The Hofpodar of Walachia, Son of Mauro Cordato, who governed long that Country, has also lately writ to the Primate, to notify his succeeding to his Father, and having Orders from the Ottoman Porte to live in strict Union with the Republick of Poland; which Orders, he says, agree entirely with his Inclinations, and that he will upon every Occasion give them Proofs of it.
