H E Sovereign of the moft Noble Order of the Garter having con-fituted the Honourable William Prince of Orange and Naflau, lately elected a Companion of that Order, with the Gar-ter, George, and the other Enfigns and Ha-bits thereof; Mr. Anflis landed at Rotterdam upon Friday the 17th Day of July, N. S. in the Evening, and next Morning haftened to the Hague, where attending upon Mr. Finch, they in the Afternoon had a private Audience of his Highnefs, to whom Mr. Finch made the proper Salutations, and then they delivered their Credential Letters fign'd by the Sovereign, and fealed with the Signet of the Order; which his Highnefs having perufed, was pleafed to declare, that he was very fenfible of the great Honour his Majefty delign'd for him : Garter then taking the Book containing the Statutes of the Order, attested under and covered with Turky Carpets; in the the Great Seal, enclosed in a Silver Box Middle whereof a Stall was erected with a whereon the Arms of the Sovereign were engraven, and having killed it, delivered the fame to Mr. Finch, who prefented it to his Highness, that he thereby might be fully apprized of fuch Engagements as would be re-quired from him upon his Acceptance of this Elcutcheon of his Arms, inferibed with his Order.
