Hereas John Earl of Sutherland was duly elected and returned to be one of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, to fit in the House of Peers of the present Parliament of Great Britain, and is fince deceased; in Order to the electing another Peer of Scotland to sit in his Room, We do by the Advice of our Privy Council, issue forth this our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to affemble and meet at Holy-Rood-House in Edinburgh on Friday the twenty-first Day of September next en-fuing, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Asternoon, to nominate and choose another Peer of Scotland to sit and vote in the House of Peers of this present Parliament of Great Britain, in the Room of the said John Earl of Sutherland deceased, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies for such as thall be absent, such Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly figned before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law. And the Lord Clerk Register, or such two of the principal

twenty-five Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the meeting of the said Peers to proceed to fuch Election.

Given at our Court at Hampton Court the Second Day of Auguit, 1733, in the Seventh Year of our Reign. God fave the King.
