Sir Robert Walpole in breaft; then the Earl of Burlington by himfelf; and last of all the Duke of Devonihire and Earl of Wilmington together, offered in the Manner and for the Reasons above mentioned.

The Knights Companions and the Proctor being thus returned to their Stalls, remained there until Divine Service was ended, and then were all fummoned to defeend into the Area under their respective Banners, according to the Method recited above, that a Proceilion might be made down to the West Gate of the Chapel, and through the South Itle, and out of the Door there, up to the Lodgings in the high Caftle, but the Rain prevented it; so as the Return was made through the North Isle into the Dean's Lodgings, wherein, after the Drums and Trumpets, the Poor Knights went, and next to them the Prebends, after whom the Officers of Arms followed, and then the Officers of the Order went immediately before the Two new initalled Knights, being followed by the Six other Companions, and laft of all the Proctor of the Prince of Orange, from whom the Mantle was received when he came to the Outfide of the Door of the Chapel : And all these proceeded in the fame Rank, and Manner, as they had formerly entred into the Choir.

There was a splendid Dinner in the Guard Chamber, at the Expence of the Sovereign, where the Companions dined in their full Habits. Upon bringing in the Second Courfe, Garter, with the Officers of Arms attending, proclaimed the Styles of the Duke of Devonfhire and Earl of Wilmington; the Styles of his Highness the Prince of Orange having been proclaimed at the Time of his Invefti-ture, according to the Cuftom in fuch Cafes.

Hague, Aug. 25, N. S. The States of Guelderland have conformed themfelves to the Refolution of the fix other Provinces concerning the Neutrality of the Auftrian Netherlands : Their Deputies to the States General returned hither on Sunday laft, and delivered Yesterday to the Astembly their Concurrence therein.
