'E have received Advices from Bergen, that the Danish Court arrived there the 13th Instant, and intended to fet out on its Return to Christiana on the 17th; fo that if the Wind proves fair, the King may be reafon-

ably expected every Hour at Elfenore, where they fay his Majefty purpoles to difembark. *Hague, Sept.* 4, N. S. The Prince of O-range taking the Air this Morning in a Fourwheel'd Chaife, had an Accident of being thrown out of it as he paffed thro' a Turnpike, by one of the Wheels hitting against a Post; but his Highnels has received no great Damage by it. The Post from Warsaw has again failed, fo that no one here has had any Advice directly from thence with Regard to the Affairs of Poland.
