THIS Day the Diet of Election opened, but nothing material was done, nor even the Election of a Marshal spoke of.

Hague, Sept. 8, N. S. Count Sinzendorff and Mr. Finch had Yesterday a Conference with the Deputies of the States upon the Affairs of the Low Countries, as had this Day the Marquês de Fenelon, who received back Yesterday in the Evening his Courier which he had dispatched to his Court with the Resolution of the States relating to the Neutrality for the said Low Countries. The Assembly of the States of Holland is fixed for Wednesday next. M. de Loos, the Saxon Minister, who is appointed to succeed M. Bunau at the Court of Great Britain, proposes to embark next Friday for England.
