Copenhagen, September 15, N. S.

HE Danish Ministers received Yesterday certain Advice from Jutland, that the King and Queen, with the whole Court, happily landed on the 10th at Flastrand. The Master of a Vessel lately come in here from Konigsberg, has reported to the Grand Chamberlain, that before his Departure from that Place, King Stanislaus was arrived in Foland, and proclaimed King.

Copenhagen, Sept. 19, N. S. We have just received Advice from Elsenore, that nine French Men of War, under the Command of a Vice Admiral, and which sailed from Brest the 1st Instant, arrived in the Sound on the 1sth, about Seven a-Clock in the Evening; that three Men of War and a Frigate belonging to that Squadron were then behind, having been separated from the others by bad Weather; that the said Squadron saluted the Castle of Cronenburg with Eleven Guns; which Compliment the Governour returned with the like Number.

Hague, Sept. 25, N. S. The Letters from Warsaw of the 14th Instant are just arrived; they mention nothing else but the Election of King Stanislaus. The Government of Heulden was this Day conferred by the States General on the Count de Bentheim, a Major General in the Army.

To all which he was introduced by the Master of the Ceremonies.
