*Berlin, September 19, N. S.*

**L** E T T E R S from Warlaw of the 13th advise, that General Lacy, with the Body of Troops under his Command, was advanced beyond Grodno, and that the other Body of Muscovites which were encamped at Smolensko, had also entered Poland.

*Dublin-Castle, Sept. 17.*

This Day arrived his Grace the Duke of Dorset, Lord Lieutenant of this Kingdom. His Grace was received at his Landing by their Excellencies the Lords Justices, and by the Lord-Mayor, Aldermen, and Sheriffs of Dublin. The Foot Forces in Garrison, with the Militia of the City, lined the Streets through which his Grace (attended by a Regiment of Horse, the Battle-Axe Guards, and the other Officers attending the State) proceeded, amidst the Acclamations of a vast Concourse of People, to the Castle. Upon which the great Guns at the Barracks were fired, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments on Duty, which were drawn out upon College-Green; and his Grace received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction upon his safe Arrival in this Kingdom.
