Copenhagen, September 26. N. S.

ON the 23d, about Eight a Clock at Night, their Danish Majesties came to Fredericksberg in perfect Health, after a very long and dangerous Voyage about the Coast of Norway and in the Categat. The 24th their Majesties came hither, and having received the Compliments of the Nobility and foreign Ministers, returned Yesterday in the Forenoon to Fridericksberg. The French Squadron still remains in this Road; the Rear Admiral having suffered very much, is brought into Port to be repaired.

Berlin, Sept. 26. N. S. It is reported here, that Letters have been received from Poland of the 22d Instant, which advise, that Affairs in that Kingdom were in the utmost Confusion; that the Primate was retired to Dantzick; and that King Stanislaus had left Warsaw.

Hague, Oct. 2, N. S. The last Letters received here from Warsaw advise, that the Mulcovites were approaching that Town; that the Confederates had joined them; and, that it was not doubted but their Design was to elect and proclaim another King. Baron Stark, who is going to execute a Commission at the Court of Great Britain from the

Duke of Holstein, being likewise accredited to the States General, delivered Yesterday his Credential Letters to their High Mightinesses. The Express that the Marquess de Fenelon dispatched some Time ago, to Paris with the last Resolution of the States General relating to the Neutrality for the Low-Countries, is not yet arrived.
