IT is confirmed from all Parts, that King Stanislaus retired from Warsaw upon the Approach of the Muscovite Army, the 24th of September last to Dantzick. Baron Starck, the Holstein Minister, had this Morning a Conference with the States General, and will set out for England in a few Days. M. Borck, who goes to England on the Part of the King of Prussia, is arrived here, and designs to embark Tomorrow for London.
