*Petersbourg, September 8, O. S.*

**M.** Rudamina, the Polish Minister, had his Audience of Leave of her Czarish Majesty the 27th of last Month, and set out two Days ago on his Return to Warsaw. The 6th Instant the River Neva rose so high, that it overflowed all this Town, and was about two Feet deep in the Streets; but the Overflowing has not done any great Damage.

*Stockholm, Sept. 19, O. S.* The King of Sweden went Yesterday to take the Diversion of Hunting, and will return next Saturday. M. Bestuchef, Minister from the Czarina, has the Honour to accompany his Majesty. The French Ambassadour gave last Monday an Entertainment to all the Senators in Town, and the Ministers of the Chancery, on Occasion of King Stanislaus being proclaimed King of Poland.

*Copenhagen. Oct. 3, N. S.* The French Squadron remains still in this Road, the Rear Admiral being not yet repaired. The French Ambassadour gave, on the 30th Instant, a magnificent Dinner, and a Ball at Night, upon the News received from Warsaw of King Stanislaus being proclaimed King of Poland; and Count Lucern gave also an Entertainment on Board the 1st Instant; at both which a great many Persons of Distinction were present.
