About Eight of the Clock Yesterday in the Evening a Courier arrived here from France, and brought M. de Fenelon Advice, that the French Army had passed the Rhine and laid Siege to Fort Kehl; which News the said Minister notified this Morning to the Ministers of the State; and likewise communicated to them the French King's Manifesto. The States of Holland are summoned to meet on Wednesday next. Two Ships, being part of the five of the East-India Fleet that were wanting, are safely arrived, and the other three are daily expected. Letters from Berlin advise, that the Elector of Saxony was elected and proclaimed King of Poland on the 5th Instant at Praag, by the Confederates.

Hampton-Court, October 11.

This Day Sidi Mohamed, and Jusuf Co-gia, Envoys from the Bey of Tunis, had Audience of His Majesty; to which they were introduced by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Master of the Ceremonies.

They had afterwards Audience of the Queen; to which they were introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Grantham, Her Majesty's Lord Chamberlain, and conducted by the Master of the Ceremonies.

Hampton-Court, Oct. 13. The 11th Instant being the Anniversary of their Majesties Coronation, there was at Noon, a numerous and splendid Appearance at Court of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction. The Guns in St. James's Park and at the Tower were fired; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, Ringing of Bells, and all publick Demonstrations of Joy throughout London and Westminster.

Hampton-Court, Oct. 13. The King has been pleased to give Orders that the Yachts, with a Clerk of the Greencloth and proper Officers on Board, appointed to bring over hither his Highness the Prince of Orange, should sail for Holland without Loss of Time.

And His Majesty has been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Horatio Wal-

pole, Esq; one of His most Honourable Privy Council, and Cofferer of His Majesty's Household, to go to Holland, in order to attend his Highness in his Passage from thence to England.
