H E States of Holland, who affembled on the 27th Instant, continue fitting, and it is uncertain whether they will separate To-morrow, or continue their Assembly the next Week. The Prince of Orange is a little indisposed of a Cold. The Minister of the King of Prussia has presented a Memorial to the States of Holland, demanding the Writings that re-late to those Lands and Effects that are in his Possession by Inheritance from the late King William. The Ministers of the French King and of the Emperour have Conferences almost daily with Deputies of this State upon the present Situation of Affairs. The Count d'Uhlefeld, who comes hither to relieve Count Sinzendorff, Envoy from the Em-perour, arrived here Yesterday. We have Advice from Turin, that the French and Sardinian Armies were to be on the Frontiers of the Milanese the 25th of this Month. Our Advises relating to Fort Kehl, are, that on the 22d the French began to cannonade it from two Batteries. Mr. Horatio Walpole arrived here the 28th Inflant. We have no Account yet of the Arrival of the Yachts on this Side.
