Copenhagen, October 24, N.S.

HE three French Ships which returned hither from Elfenore with a Purpofe of going on to Dantzick, failed from hence on the alft Inftant again for the Sound, in order to join the Ten Sail bound homewards. That part of the Squardon, which we believed had been forced by Strefs of Weather into fome Port of Sweden, has lately been feen off the Coaft of Norway holding it's Courfe for the Ocean. Their Danith Majefties have now their Refidence at Friedenfbourg, where Count Wartenfleben, the Pruffian Minifter, had his Audience on the 16th Inftant.

Hague, Nov 3, N.S. The States of the Province of Holland feparated on Saturday laft, to meet again at their ufual Time the Middle of this Month, unlefs fomething extraordinary fhould happen to call them together fooner. The Ministers of the Emperor and of the French King receive frequent Couriers from their respective Courts, and have Conferences as frequently with Deputies of the States. Letters from Hambourg advife, that King Stanislaus was very much indispofed at Dantzick.

Hampton-Court, October 25.
