Copenhagen, October 24, N. S.

THE three French Ships which returned hither from Elsenore with a Purpose of going on to Dantzick, failed from hence on the 21st Instant again for the Sound, in order to join the Ten Sail bound homewards. That part of the Squadron, which we believed had been forced by Strefs of Weather into some Port of Sweden, has lately been seen off the Coast of Norway holding its Course for the Ocean. Their Danish Majesties have now their Residence at Friedenbourg, where Count Wartenleben, the Prussian Minister, had his Audience on the 16th Instant.

Hague, Nov 3, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland separated on Saturday last, to meet again at their usual Time the Middle of this Month, unless something extraordinary should happen to call them together sooner. The Ministers of the Emperor and of the French King receive frequent Couriers from their respective Courts, and have Conferences as frequently with Deputies of the States. Letters from Hambourg advise, that King Stanislaus was very much indisposed at Dantzick.

Hampton-Court, October 25.

This Day Mr. le Baron Starck, Minister from the Duke of Holstein, had his first private Audience of his Majesty, to deliver his Letters of Credence; to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Harrington, one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Knight, Master of the Ceremonies.

He had afterwards a private Audience of her Majesty; to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Grantham, her Majesty's Lord Chamberlain, and conducted by the Master of the Ceremonies.

Trinity-House, London, Oct. 24, 1733.
