The Duke of Wirtemberg died the 31st of last Month, according to the Advices received here. His Succeffor, Prince Alexander of Wirtemberg, is at Vienna, where he some time ago embraced the Roman Catholick Re-ligion, and married the Daughter of the Prince de Taxis, by whom he has several Children. The last Letters from Dantzick fay, King Stanislaus was still there, and had affured the Magistrates, that he would in proper Time provide for their Sasety and his own.
