

Highness continued with the Royal Family till Eleven a-Clock. Friday the 9th great Numbers of Persons of Quality and others paid their Compliments to his Highness, being presented by the Master of the Ceremonies. Then his Highness went again to Court in the same Manner as before, attended by Sir Clement Cottrell, to her Majesty's Apartments, the King's Levee being just over; and after some Time returned to Somerset House to Dinner. On Thursday and Friday several of the Lords of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and other Peers, dined with his Highness. On the Friday after Dinner the Count de Montijo, the Spanish Ambassadour Extraordinary, having the Day before sent to desire an Hour, made a Visit to his Highness. In the Evening his Highness being conducted as before to St. James's, went first to the Princess Royal's Drawing Room; which being over, his Highness went to the Queen's Drawing Room, and thence returned late to Somerset House.
