HIS Morning the Marquefs de Fenelon, Ambaffadour from his moft Chriftian Majelty, and the Deputies of the States, figned the Act of Neutrality for the Auftrian Low Countries, and fome Hours after Mr. Finch was invited to a Conference by the faid Deputies, to acquaint him with it. This Afternoon the Marquefs de Fenelon difpatched an Express to his Court with the Inftrument, in order to its being ratified by the King his Mafter. Letters from Berlin of the 17th fay, that the Magiftracy of Dantzick had hinted to King Staniflaus and his Party, that their Stay might be of great Inconvenience to them ; upon which M. Poniatowsky and others were already retired, and that King Staniflaus himfelf was preparing to leave that Place. This News is confirmed by the laft Letters from Dantzick.
