N Order has been published in the Emperor's Name, commanding all Subjects of the Kings of France and Sardinia to depart this Kingdom within a limited Time, excepting thole who have married Natives of this Country, or have been fettled in it Ten Years. Preparations are making with all Diligence by the Imperialists for the Defence of this Kingdom, and feveral German Officers are newly arrived, and others are on their Way hither.

Milan, Nov. 18. The French and Piemontele Troops left to block up our Caftle, have been employed for some Days past in throwing up Earth and making Trenches in all the Avenues to it, to cover them-felves against the small Shot of the Garrison. An Ingenier who adventured too near the Caftle on the 11th Inftant, was shot dead

by a Centinel. Paris, Nov. 29, N. S. There is an Ac-count from Turin, by Letters dated the 21ft Inftant, that the Trenches before Pizzighitone were opened in the Night between the 17th and 18th. This Attack is not made on the Body of the Town, but on a Fort on the Side of the Adda which covers the Bridge of Pizzighitone. The first Approach was made with fo little Noife, that the Beliegers had covered themfelves before the Garrison took the Alarm. The French loft but few Men the first and second Nights. Part of their Army was to pais the Adda the 19th, to attack the main Body of the Place. Four Battallions and a Regimens of Dragoons were to march at the fame Time, to take Possellion of Cremona, which the Ger-

mans had abandoned fome Time ago. Hague, Dec. 4, N. S. Count d'Uhle-feld, the new Imperial Minister, has presented a Memorial, to demand in the Name of the Emperour, the States Leave to borrow Two Millions of Florins upon the Revenues of Silefia. The Place of Fifcal of the Court of Juffice being vacant by the Death of M. Nobeling, is like to produce fome Diffention between the States of Holland and those of Zealand, the last pretending it is their Turn to name to it, and the other being defirous to put in an Hollander. The last Advices we have from Poland differ very much : King Staniflaus continued at Dantzick, and it is pretended by his Friends that his Circumstances are not in fuch a Condition as is reprefented by the other Party. On the other Side it is writ, that the Muccovite Army was actually

marching towards Dantzick, and would foon oblige that Town to expel King Staniflaus. What the feveral Advices deliver for certain, is, that all Poland is in Confusion and Dif-order, and the Country plundered by both Parties. They add from Dantzick, that they had there a Confirmation of the Tartars having defeated in Ukrania a Body of Mulco-vites and Coffacks, and killed Twelve Thousand of them.
